
The Need

Peter Paul Community Center: Empowerment through Education

Peter Paul is an outreach and community center serving children and families in Richmond's East End. When the pandemic hit, all Richmond City Public Schools went virtual and have remained mostly remote. To meet the moment, Peter Paul Community Center began offering remote classrooms with virtual academic support and enrichment opportunities for students. They have expanded to offer additional emergency facilitated learning centers, which includes providing transportation, for children of essential workers and teachers out of a nearby middle school.

Peter Paul partners with the whole family. Through the Promise Family Network, parents have created a community focused on strengthening their family wellbeing and developing stronger relationships between parents, children and other families. Activities include weekly virtual hangouts and dinner and discussions, where families come together to cook fun and easy recipes and discuss issues around self-care, parenting, and much more.

Peter Paul is the perfect example of the strong community ties afterschool programs have and how those connections are a powerful tool in keeping kids learning and families engaged during the most challenging times!
